


ISOLATION ISLANDS

You are Les Ebbage, husband of Phyllis who has been held in medical detention in the Peel Island leprosarium since January 1940.

The year is 1941 and you have just been fined 10 pounds by authorities when you were caught making secret visits to your wife on the Island.

A journalist at the local newspaper has suggested you **write a letter to the editor**. This is a chance to tell Phyllis's story and respond to the outpouring of public sympathy that has arisen since your arrest.
